Dr. Daniel Mize, born on January 26, 1976, is from the Adi (Minyong) tribe of Arunachal Pradesh. He originally hailed from Bamin (Bilat) Village, P.O. Bilat in East Siang district of Arunachal Pradesh. He did his MSc (Zoology) from Arunachal University in 1999 and subsequently obtained his PhD from Rajib Gandhi University, Itanagar in the year 2012. Initially, he started his service career as an Assistant Professor (part-time) in the Department of Zoology, Arunachal University, Doimukh, Arunachal Pradesh, India from August 2004 to February 2005, and then shifted to the Department of Zoology, Jawaharlal Nehru College, Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh and worked there till September 2005. Thereafter, he joined as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Zoology, Rajiv Gandhi University, Doimukh, Arunachal Pradesh and currently he is working there as an Associate Professor.

Dr. Mize has been working as a leading researcher in Arunachal Pradesh particularly in the area of ornithology and wildlife, and currently monitoring the Vulture and Blacknecked Crane population trend in Arunachal Pradesh and looking at the composition of the avian community and diversity in relation to altitude gradient, changes in season and different habitats. He is also studying the distribution pattern of vultures in Arunachal Pradesh and the influence of environmental and anthropogenic factors on it. He has been teaching ecology, statistics, wildlife and ornithology at the postgraduate level since 2005.
